

# Weekly Reflection

Each year, the Church invites us through her liturgy to prepare ourselves for the coming of the Lord. Advent signifies a time of preparation and expectation, not just as a remembrance of what happened more than two thousand years ago, but also as a preparation for the coming of Jesus. During Advent, the Church invites us to meditate on the three comings of Jesus.

In the first coming, Jesus took our flesh and our weakness. He was seen on earth and dwelt among us, as we pray in the angelus. In this first coming, Jesus came as our Savior and Redeemer, to destroy sin and death with his passion, death, and resurrection.

In the third and final coming, Jesus will appear again, but now in his glory and majesty. He will come as the judge of the living and the dead. And he will give the reward of eternal life to those who accepted his grace, and he will give a judgment of condemnation to those who rejected it.

Now between these two comings of our Lord, the humble one in Bethlehem, and the glorious one of the Last Judgement, Jesus also comes. In a particular way, He comes through the sacraments of the Church. He comes to wash away our sins, restore gladness, and nourish our souls.

Let us accept Jesus's grace through a worthy reception of the sacraments, then we will remember with joy his coming at Bethlehem and expect with great desires his final and triumphant coming.

#### **Holy Matrimony**


Marriage is a union of love and a response to God's call to holiness. The love of husband and wife becomes the symbol of God's love on earth.






# Parish Capital Campaign

This work challenged the students to combine their knowledge of mathematics, science, humanities, and theology to explore perhaps the most infamously abused misapplication of mathematical modeling to real-world phenomena. The study culminated with an essay and presentation that adumbrated the challenge of our Senior Theses, simply on a smaller scale.

The junior class presented their completed work in the Ave Maria University lecture hall over four consecutive evenings, demonstrating the truly distinctive way in which Donahue Academy students are formed and educated in integrating disciplines, the richness of a classical education, and the importance of the ways in which the Catholic Church must confront modernity.
