

Weekly Reflection

In his Apostolic Letter, "At the Beginning of the New Millennium" (Novo Millennio Ineunte, 2000), St. John Paull II presents the road map of our journey towards Heaven. He tells us that "We shall not be saved by a formula but by a Person, and his assurance: 'I am with you always, until the end of the age!' (Mt 28:20)."

St. John Paul II makes another important observation: "Conscious of the Risen Lord's presence among us, we ask ourselves today the same question put to Peter in Jerusalem immediately after his Pentecost speech: 'What must we do?" (Acts 2:37).

Jesus offers us salvation. Now, what must we do? We must believe in Christ, of course, but at the same time, our belief must be accompanied by works of faith. St. Augustine is completely aware of this need, and thus, he claims: "God who created you without you, will not save you without you," (St. Augustine, Sermo 169, 13, PL 38,923)

Then, what must be do? St. John Paul II offers a perennial programme of spiritual renewal, which is rooted in the Gospel and the living Tradition, namely: "holiness, prayer, the Sunday Eucharist, the Sacrament of Reconciliation, the primacy of grace, listening to the Word, and proclaiming the Word." In the next weeks, I will expand on these objectives.

THE SACRAMENTS



Baptism

The Sacrament of Baptism is often called "The door of the Church" since it is the first of the seven sacraments not only in time but also in priority because the reception of the other sacraments depends on it. It is the first of the three Sacraments of Initiation, the other two are "Confirmation" and "Holy Communion."

Holy Matrimony

Holy Matrimony is the sacrament of the Church that unites one man and one woman to each other and to God for the sake of the salvation of their own souls and to help share in Christ's mission in the world. The celebration of marriage is also a liturgical act, appropriately held in a public liturgy at Church.

*Arrangements must be made at least 6 months prior. Must be registered parishioner & been attending Mass for 3 months.



Baptism, the saving waters that bring the Holy Spirit and welcomes Catholics into the Church.

Confession, the experiencing of God's mercy, exercised through the ministry of priests.

First Communion, receiving the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Christ under the appearance of bread and wine.

Confirmation, being sealed and strengthened by the gift of the Holy Spirit to be a living witness to Christ.

Anointing of the Sick, bringing spiritual and, sometimes physical strength in times of illness or impending death.

How do I become Catholic? Maybe you've attended Mass with us for a while, or maybe you've just met a Catholic and you were intrigued by her faith. Perhaps you were baptized Catholic as a child, attended some Catechism classes, but you have not really been practicing the faith these last few years. So where do you start?





Reflexión Semanal



En su Carta Apostólica, "Al Inicio del Tercer Milenio" (*Novo Millennio Ineunte*, 2000), San Juan Pablo II presenta la hoja de ruta de nuestro camino al Cielo. El nos dice que "nosotros no nos salvaremos por una fórmula, si no, por medio de una Persona y su promesa: 'Yo estaré siempre con ustedes hasta el fin de los tiempos,' (Mt. 28:20)." San Juan Pablo II hace otra observación importante: "Conscientes de la presencia del Señor Resucitado entre nosotros, nos preguntamos lo mismo que le preguntaron a Pedro luego de Pentecostés: '¿Qué debemos hacer?' (Hechos 2:37)".

Jesús nos ofrece la salvación. Nosotros, '¿qué debemos hacer? Debemos creer en Jesucristo, por supuesto, pero al mismo tiempo nuestro creer en Jesús debe estar acompañado por obras de fe. San Agustín es plenamente consciente de esta necesidad y por eso dice: "Dios que te creó sin tí, no te salvará sin tí," (S. Agustín, Sermon 169,13).

Entonces, ¿qué debemos hacer? San Juan Pablo II ofrece un programa permanente de renovación spiritual que se fundamenta en el Evangelio y en la Tradición viva; y es este: santidad, oración, la Eucaristía Dominical, el Sacramento de la Reconciliación, la primacía de la gracia, el escuchar la Palabra, y el proclamar la Palabra. En las próximas semanas, desarrollaré estos temas.

Sacramentos, Preparación, Quinceañera, y RCIA

El **bautismo**, nos introduce a las aguas salvadoras que nos trae el Espíritu Santo y nos hace miembros de la Iglesia.

La **confesión,** nos hace vivir la misericordia de Dios, ejercida a través del ministerio de los sacerdotes.

Primera Comunión, nos hace participar de la vida de Jesús, recibiendo su Cuerpo, Sangre, Alma y Divinidad bajo la apariencia de pan y vino.

Confirmación, nos sella por medio de los dones del Espíritu Santo para ser testigos vivos de Cristo.

Unción de los enfermos, nos da la fortaleza espiritual e incluso física en tiempos de enfermedad o en peligro de muerte.




