Weekly Reflection



Work has dignity in God's plan of creation. At the beginning of the Book of Genesis, it is said that man was created *"in the image of God… male and female."* Then, God told them to *"be fruitful and multiply, and fill the earth and subdue it,"* (Gen 1:27-28). With our work, we share in the Creator's work and continue it. Work has a noble origin. Work is a blessing, not a curse.

However, after the original sin, toil was added to the blessing of work: "*Cursed is the ground because of you; in toil, you shall eat of it all the days of your life,*" (Gen 3:17). Toil is a punishment, as death is a punishment: "*In the sweat of your face you shall eat bread till you return to the ground, for out of it you were taken,*" (Gen 3:19).

Now, with Jesus, human work acquires another dimension. Christ came to accomplish the work of redemption. He assumed our nature and worked for our salvation, and his sweat reached the extreme of being drops of blood. With Jesus, what was a punishment becomes a blessing. With Jesus, we can offer our toils and sacrifices, our sweat and tears, and even our death in union with Christ as an acceptable sacrifice of redemption.

Let us give meaning to our work, sweat, and tears! Let them be part of the daily prayer. By uniting work with prayer, let us discover in our work not only some earthly progress but also the development of the Kingdom of God. Happy Labor Day!

Holy Matrimony


Marriage is a beautiful vocation from God to an exclusive, lifelong union between a man and a woman open to receiving God's blessing of children. Jesus performed His first miracle at the wedding at Cana (cf. Jn. 2:1-11) to show His particular care for marriage which He elevated from its natural state to the dignity of a Sacrament.

*Arrangements must be made at least 6 months prior. Must be registered parishioner & been attending Mass for 3 months.

Anointing of the Sick

Fraternus in Ave Maria Parish

Fraternus in Ave Maria Parish has resumed meetings on Wednesdays from 6:30 - 8:30 PM at Donahue Academy.

What is Fraternus? Fraternus is a group of men and boys who gather each week - "Frat Night" during the academic year. Fraternus meets for 2 hours of prayer, the study of virtues, meal sharing, recreation, and most importantly, opportunities to build the brotherhood through friendship and sharing in age-organized "squads."

What is the qualifying age for Fraternus? 13 years of age and up. We set up ageappropriate squads led by Dads and men to help guide the boys as needed. Boys progress through ranks right up until Knighthood and beyond. All men are welcome to join and assist as needed.

With a focus on recreation and squad time discussion based on the seven cardinal virtues, Fraternus allows Fathers to meet their sons "where they are" in their walk of faith as they confront the challenges of growing up in today's secular society.

Ave Maria Faith Formation classes are starting soon!

Children's Eucharistic Adoration-Jean Prather (Catholic Kids 101) leads children of all ages in reflections, stories, prayers, and the rosary. Weekly adoration sessions are on Mondays, from 7:00-8:00 pm in the Church.

St. Margaret Castello Ministry-Sacramental Development for persons with special needs and their families. Classes start Friday, September 30th, with adoration from 6:30-7:00 pm in the Church and continuing catechesis in the parish hall until 8:00 pm.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS)-Kindergarten and First Grade (1st year First Communion Preparation): A reflective-based program of religious formation that is rooted in Scripture and the Liturgy.
