Weekly Reflection



Saint Thomas Aquinas says that we are in the “*Horizon and confines of things corporeal and incorporeal*,” (Contra Gentiles II, 68). He also uses another expression as he teaches that: “*We are on the confines of spiritual and corporeal creatures*,” (Summa Theologiae I, 77, 2).

God created purely material creatures and purely spiritual creatures, and God also created us, human beings, that harmonize the spiritual and corporeal conditions in a single subject.

Because we have a body, we are subject to time: we grow and mature. Because we have a spirit, we are open to eternity: we started to exist and will always exist. Therefore, we can say that we are in the confines of time and eternity.

That is our meaning! And that is our purpose as well. We come from God, and we return to God. And our return to God begins the very same moment we are conceived. At that very moment, we start a journey.

We know that we are in the world, but at the same time, we understand that we do not belong to the world. We belong to God. That is what Saint Augustine discovered and most beautifully expressed in a passage of his *Confessions*, 1: “*You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in You.*”

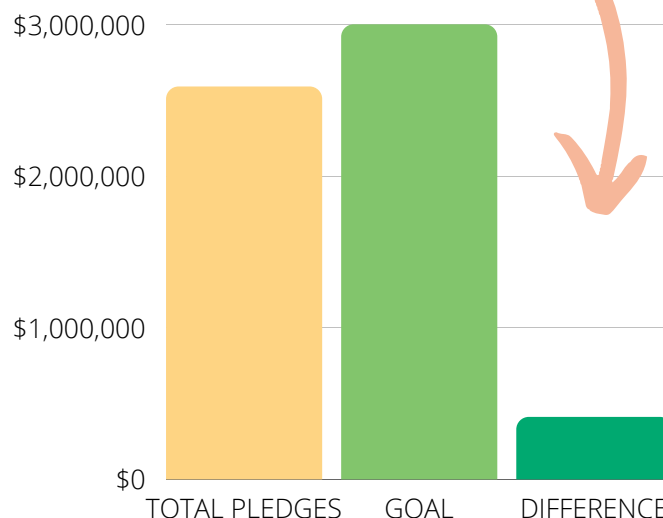
Parish Capital Campaign

Reflexión Semanal



Santo Tomás de Aquino enseña que los seres humanos nos encontramos en el *“Horizonte y confín de las cosas corporales e incorpóreas,”* (Contra Gentiles II, 68). El usa otra expresión cuando dice que *“Nosotros estamos en el confín entre las creaturas espirituales y corporales,”* (Summa Theologiae I, 77,2).

Dios ha creado creaturas puramente materiales y creaturas puramente espirituales, y Dios también nos ha creado a nosotros, seres humanos, que armonizamos las condiciones espirituales y corporales en un solo sujeto.

Porque tenemos un cuerpo, estamos sometidos al tiempo: crecemos y maduramos. Porque tenemos un espíritu, estamos abiertos a la eternidad: hemos comenzado a existir e existiremos siempre. Por eso, podemos decir que nos encontramos entre el confín del tiempo y la eternidad. ¡Esto es lo que nos define! ¡Este es nuestro fin también! Venimos de Dios y retornamos a Dios. Y nuestro retorno a Dios comienza en el mismo momento de nuestra concepción. En ese mismo momento, comenzamos nuestro peregrinar.

Sabemos que estamos en el mundo, pero al mismo tiempo, entendemos que no pertenecemos al mundo. Pertenecemos a Dios. Esto es lo que San Agustín descubrió y muy hermosamente expresó en un pasaje de sus Confesiones, 1: *“Señor, nos hiciste para Ti y nuestro corazón está inquieto hasta que descansa en Ti.”*
