Weekly Reflection



In 1998, Saint John Paul II wrote the Apostolic Letter DIES DOMINI. Based on St John Paul II's teachings, we will dedicate some of our weekly reflections to the importance of **Sunday, the Day of the Lord.**

Sunday is the Day of the Parish Community. In his speech to Bishops of the United States of America (1998), St. John Paul II affirmed that among the many activities of a Parish, "none is as vital or as community-forming as the Sunday celebration of the Lord's Day and his Eucharist." This is also the teaching of the Second Vatican Council, in Sacrosanctum Concilium, 42, where it indicates that we need to raise "within the Parish, a lively sense of community in the first place through the community celebration of Sunday Mass." Every Sunday, the Eucharistic Celebration takes place at the Parish Church in order "to foster the sense of the Church community," Sacred Congregation of Rites, Instruction on the Worship of the Eucharistic Mystery, (1967), 26.

St. John Paul II also teaches that at Sunday Masses in parishes, it is normal to find different groups, movements, associations, and even the smaller religious communities present in the Parish. This allows everyone to experience in common what they share most deeply beyond their particular spiritual paths. For this reason, on Sunday, small group Masses are not encouraged. Sunday is the day when we gather as a Parish Community to celebrate the Day of the Lord!




PARISH CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

"I urge priests, religious and lay people to continue and redouble their efforts to teach the younger generations the meaning and value of Eucharistic adoration and devotion. How will young people be able to know the Lord if they are not introduced to the mystery of His presence? Like the young Samuel, by learning the words of the prayer of the heart, they will be closer to the Lord, who will accompany them in their spiritual and human growth," Saint John Paul II.

"I also recommend that, in their catechetical training, and especially in their preparation for First Holy Communion, children be taught the meaning and the beauty of spending time with Jesus and helped to cultivate a sense of awe before his presence in the Eucharist," Pope Benedict XVI.

"Moreover, I want to encourage everyone to visit – if possible, everyday – especially amid life's difficulties, the Blessed Sacrament of the infinite love of Christ and His mercy, preserved in our churches, and often abandoned, to speak filially with Him, to listen to Him in silence and to peacefully entrust yourself to Him," Pope Francis.

Reflexión Semanal



En 1998, San Juan Pablo II escribió la Carta Apostólica DIES DOMINI. Basados en las enseñanzas de San Juan Pablo II, dedicaremos algunas de nuestras reflexiones semanales a la importancia del **Domingo, el Día del Señor.** El Domingo es el Día de la Comunidad Parroquial. En su discurso a los Obispos de los Estados Unidos (1998), San Juan Pablo II afirmaba que *"entre las numerosas actividades que desarrolla una parroquia ninguna es tan vital o formativa para la comunidad como la celebración dominical del día del Señor y de su Eucaristía."*

Cada Domingo, la Celebración Eucarística tiene lugar en la Iglesia Parroquial para *"fomentar el sentido de la comunidad ecclesial."* Sagrada Congregación de los Ritos en la Instrucción sobre el Misterio del Culto Eucaristico, (1967), 26.

San Juan Pablo II también nos dice que en las Misas dominicales de las parroquias es normal que se encuentren grupos, movimientos, asociaciones y pequeñas comunidades religiosas. La Misa dominical les permite experimentar a estos grupos lo que es más profundamente común más allá de las diferentes espiritualidades. Por esta razón, en el Domingo, no se fomentan las celebraciones eucarísticas de grupos particulares. ¡El Domingo es el día en el que nos congregamos como Comunidad Parroquial para la Celebración del Día del Señor!

Sacramentos, Preparación, Quinceañera, y RCIA

El **bautismo,** nos introduce a las aguas salvadoras que nos trae el Espíritu Santo y nos hace miembros de la Iglesia.

La **confesión,** nos hace vivir la misericordia de Dios, ejercida a través del ministerio de los sacerdotes.

Primera Comunión, nos hace participar de la vida de Jesús, recibiendo su Cuerpo, Sangre, Alma y Divinidad bajo la apariencia de pan y vino.

Confirmación, nos sella por medio de los dones del Espíritu Santo para ser testigos vivos de Cristo.

Unción de los enfermos, nos da la fortaleza espiritual e incluso física en tiempos de enfermedad o en peligro de muerte.

Las **quinceañeras** son celebraciones que tradicionalmente las familias hispanas hacen para dar gracias a Dios por el don de la vida de quien cumple los 15 años y para pedir las bendiciones de Dios.

¿Cómo me hago católico? Tal vez has asistido a misa con nosotros por un tiempo, o tal vez acabas de conocer a un católico y estabas intrigado por su fe. Quizás fuiste bautizado cuando eras niño, asististe a algunas clases de catecismo, pero realmente no has estado practicando la fe estos últimos años. Entonces, ¿por dónde empiezas?
