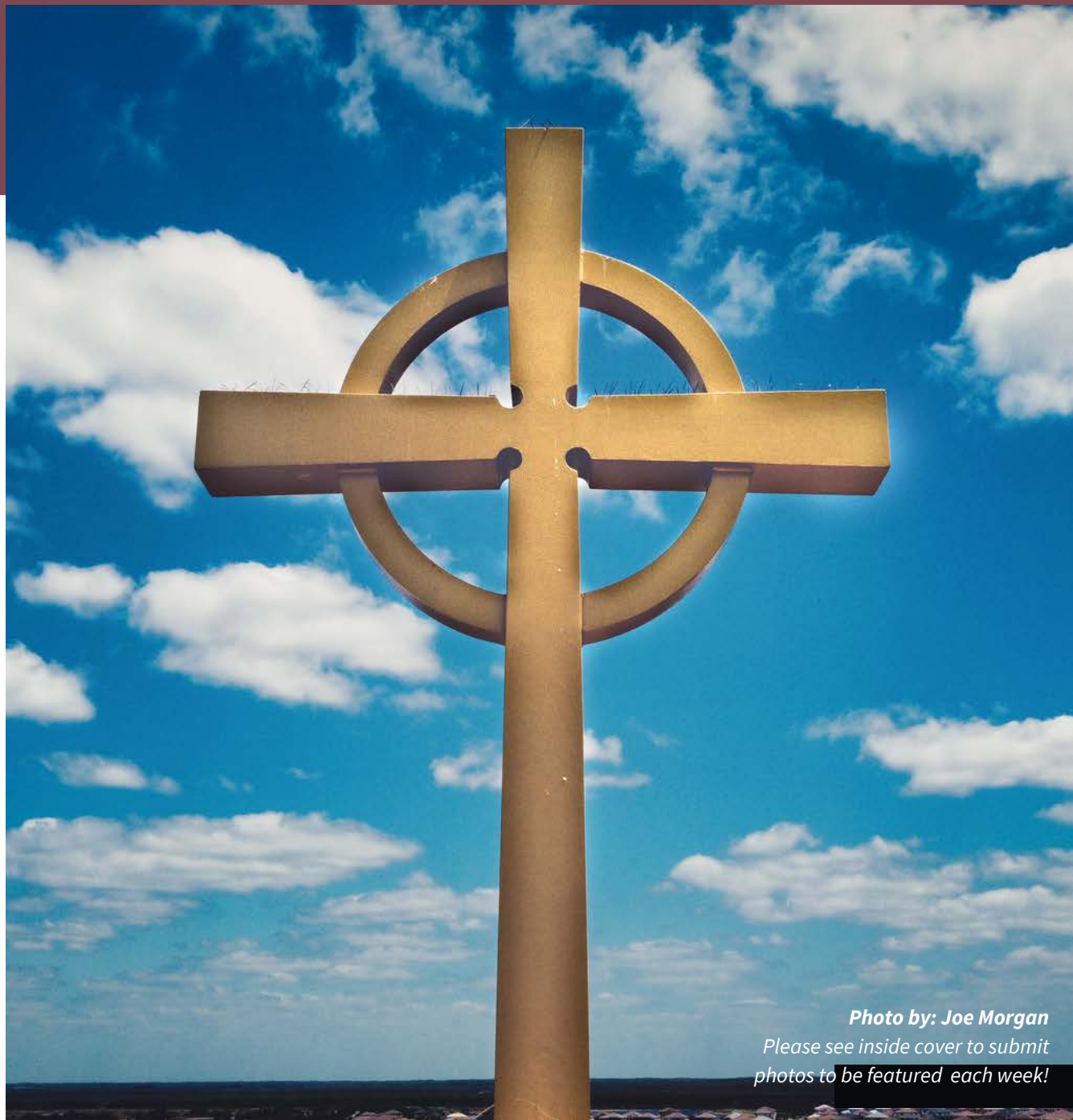

Weekly Reflection



On August 22, we celebrate the Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary. From early times, when Christians reflected upon the intimate connection between a mother and a son, they readily acknowledged the supreme royal dignity of the Mother of God.

The early writers of the Church called Mary "*the Mother of the King*" and "*the Mother of the Lord*," based on the words of the archangel Gabriel, who foretold that the Son of Mary would reign forever, and on the words of Elizabeth who greeted her with reverence and called her "*the Mother of my Lord*."

But the Blessed Virgin Mary should be called Queen, not only because of her Divine Motherhood but also because God has willed her to have an exceptional role in the work of our eternal salvation. The Blessed Virgin Mary was most closely associated with Jesus's work of redemption. The sacred liturgy sings: "*At the Cross, her station keeping, stood the mournful Mother weeping, close to Jesus to the last*," (*Stabat Mater*).

Let us reflect on Pope Pius IX's words: "*With a heart that is truly a mother's does she approach the problem of our salvation, and is solicitous for the whole human race; made Queen of heaven and earth by the Lord, exalted above all choirs of angels and saints, and standing at the right hand of her only a Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, she intercedes powerfully for us with a mother's prayers, obtains what she seeks, and cannot be refused.*"

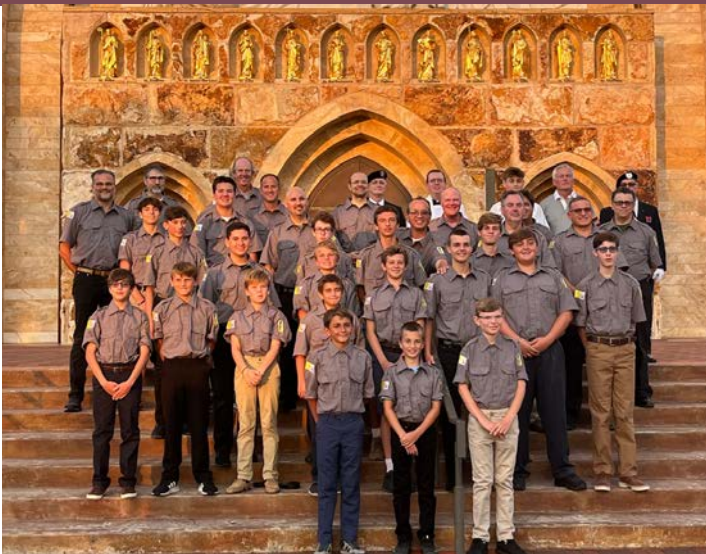

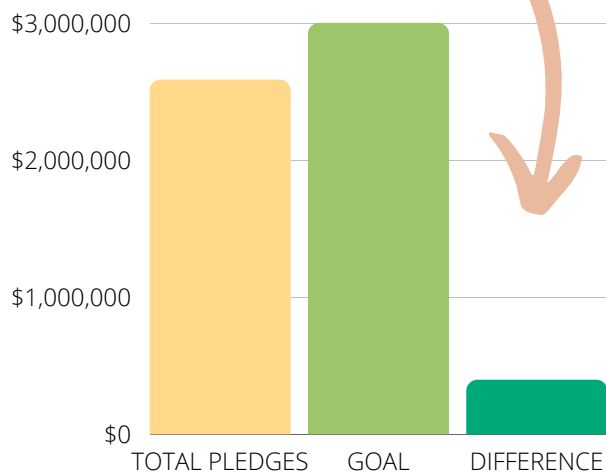

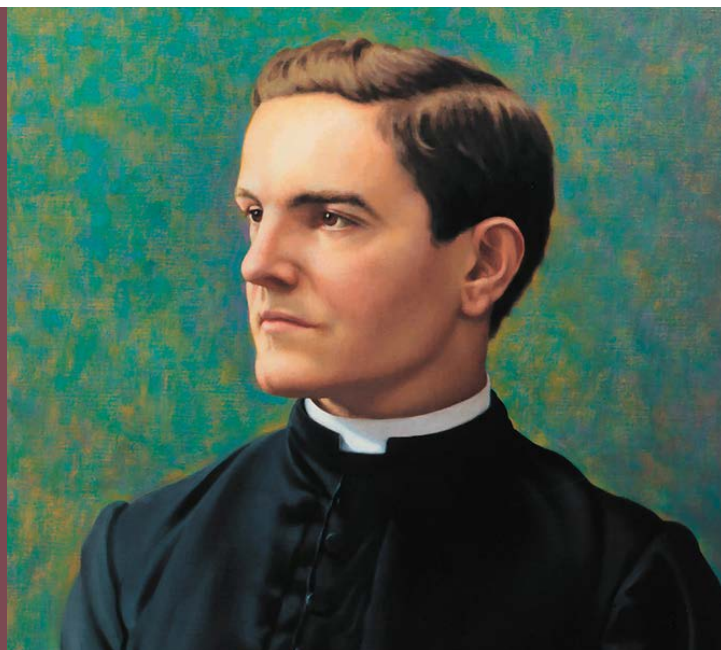
From A to Z, Ways to Grow and Serve

A small group of St. Mary's parishioners joined Fr. McGivney in assisting widows and orphans and promoting charity, fraternity, and unity. Confirmation Preparation: Confirmation is a two-year preparation process (9th/10th grades). In year-one most of the preparation is participating in Youth Ministry on Sunday evening (see below). In year-two, continued participation in Youth Ministry along with formal preparation classes during the week. 2nd year Confirmation classes start **Wednesday, October 19th, from 6:30-8:00 pm at Donahue Academy.**

Youth Ministry DTS (Dead Theologians Society): The Dead Theologians Society is a Catholic apostolate for junior/high school age teens. Through the saints of yesterday, the program inspires the youth of today to become the saints of tomorrow. Reflexión Semanal



El 22 de agosto celebramos el reinado de María. Desde antiguo, cuando los cristianos reflexionaron entre la íntima conexión entre madre e hijo, ellos rápidamente reconocieron la suprema dignidad real de la Madre de Dios. Los antiguos escritos de la Iglesia llaman a María “*Madre del Rey*” y “*Madre del Señor*” basados en las palabras del arcángel Gabriel, quien anunció que el Hijo de María reinaría para siempre, y en las palabras de Isabel, quien la saludó con reverencia llamándola “*la Madre de mi Señor*.”

Pero la Santísima Virgen debe ser llamada Reina, no sólo por su maternidad divina sino también porque Dios quiso que ella tuviera un rol excepcional en la obra de nuestra salvación. La Virgen María estuvo asociada íntimamente a la obra de la redención de Jesús. Nos lo recuerda la liturgia: “*Estaba la Madre dolorosa, llorando junto a la Cruz, de la que pendía su Hijo,*” (*Stabat Mater*).

Reflexionemos sobre las palabras del Papa Pío IX: “*Con un corazón que es verdaderamente de madre, ella se ocupa del problema de nuestra salvación. Constituida Reina del cielo y de la tierra por nuestro Señor, exaltada por sobre los coros de los ángeles y los santos, y de pie a la derecha de su único Hijo, nuestro Señor Jesucristo, ella intercede de modo poderoso por nosotros con sus plegarias de madre, y obtiene lo que pide, y nada se le rechaza.*”

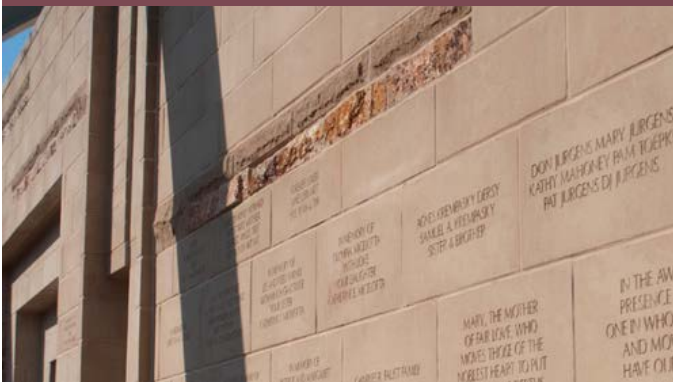
