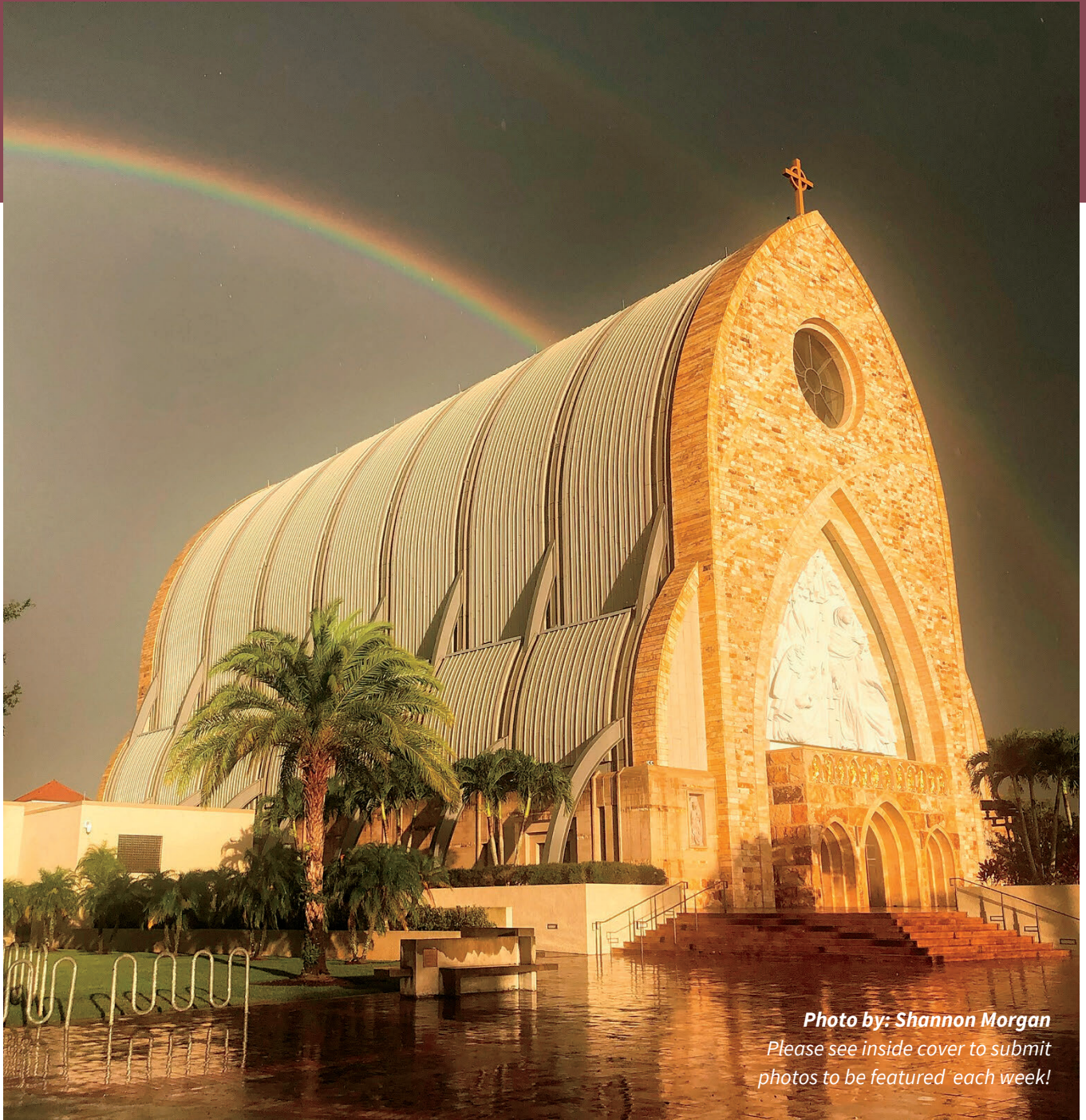

Weekly Reflection



As the new school year begins, let us give some thought to the most important work of education! In one of his talks on education, Archbishop Fulton Sheen commented: *"We should treat our minds just exactly as we treat our stomachs. We do not put garbage in our stomachs. However, our stomachs are not nearly as important as our minds. This is why it is so important to keep the right kind of thoughts in our heads."*

Let us take a moment to reflect on Archbishop Fulton Sheen's ideas. If we consume garbage, can we expect to be physically healthy? We can't. And we know it. No wonder moms try to teach their children to eat healthy so that they grow and develop properly.

Now, what we believe to be true about the body, how can it not be true when applied to the spirit? If we sow garbage in our minds and hearts, can we expect to be psychologically and spiritually healthy? We must be consistent in our thinking. The consumption of garbage ruins a person either physically or spiritually. We must learn what is true, good, and beautiful if we want to have true, good, and beautiful lives.

Let us listen to St. Paul: *"Whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is gracious, if there is any excellence, and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things . . . Then the God of peace will be with you,"* (Phil. 4:8-9). As the new school year begins, let us pray for our students, teachers, and those dedicated to the most important work of education!

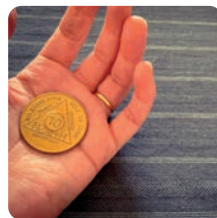
We welcome you to be at our promise ceremony in the Church after the 9:00 a.m. Mass on August 13 for those then renewing their promises and those entering our community.

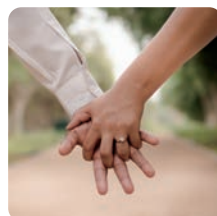

Religious Education

The below programs will be starting Wednesday, September 14, 2022, from 6:30-8:00 pm at Donahue Academy and Sunday, September 18, 2022, from 6:30-8:00 pm in the Parish Hall.

Confirmation Preparation: Confirmation is a two-year preparation process (9th/10th grades). In year-one most of the preparation is participating in Youth Ministry on Sunday evening (see below). In year-two, continued participation in Youth Ministry along with formal preparation classes during the week. 2nd year Confirmation classes start Wednesday, October 19th, from 6:30-8:00 pm at Donahue Academy.

Por eso, es tan importante llevar a nuestras mentes los pensamientos correctos."* Tomémonos un momento para reflexionar sobre estas ideas del Arzobispo Fulton Sheen.

Si consumimos basura, podemos esperar tener salud física? En realidad no. Y lo sabemos. No nos sorprende entonces que las madres traten que sus hijos coman de modo saludable para que puedan crecer y desarrollarse propiamente. Ahora, lo que nosotros creemos ser verdadero con respecto al cuerpo, cómo dejará de ser verdadero cuando se aplica a la vida del espíritu?
