
Dec. 31-Jan. 1, 2023 | Solemnity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of God

In his writing, *All Mothers Are Alike—Save One*, the Venerable Archbishop Fulton Sheen brings a story that illustrates the meaning of our celebration of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of God:

"A Catholic boy from a parochial school was telling a professor who lived next door about the Blessed Mother. The professor scoffed at the boy, saying: "But there is no difference between her and my mother." The boy answered: "That's what you say, but there's a heck of a lot of difference between the sons."

And Fulton Sheen reflected: "That is the answer. It is because Our Lord is so different from other sons that we set His Mother apart from all mothers.

Because He had an Eternal Generation in the bosom of the Father as the Son of God and a temporal generation in the womb of Mary as the Son of Man, His coming created a new set of relationships.

She is not a private person; all other mothers are. We did not make her different; we found her different. We did not choose Mary; He did."

The Church recognizes that Mary, the *Theotokos*, the Mother of God, assures the reality of the Incarnation because — as Saint Augustine says: "If the Mother were fictitious, [Jesus's] flesh would also be fictitious... and the scars of the Resurrection." (Tract. in Ev. Ioannis, 8, 6-7).

Then, today and always, we pray: "Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us!"



THE TREASURE AND HEART OF THE CHURCH!

The Catholic Church describes the Eucharist, i.e., the Sacrifice of the Mass, as "the source and summit of the Christian life" (CCC 1324). It's the source, because the Eucharist enables us to make present and offer anew Jesus Christ's one redemptive Sacrifice of Calvary, which began with his Passion (CCC 1362-68; 1341). It's the summit, because the Eucharist is truly a foretaste of heaven, in which we partake of Jesus' body and blood as heaven and earth become most profoundly one.

In our parish, we have recently had a Eucharistic Procession through our neighborhoods. With that, we proclaimed that Jesus in the Eucharist is at the center of this town and at the center of our lives as a parish community.

Reflexión Semanal



En su escrito, Todas las Madres son Iguales – Excepto Una, El Venerable Arzobispo Fulton Sheen trae una historia que ilustra el significado de nuestra celebración de la Bienaventurada Virgen María, Madre de Dios:

"Un niño católico de una escuela parroquial hablaba sobre la Santísima Madre con un profesor que vivía junto a su casa. El profesor en tono burlón le decía al niño: "Sin embargo, no hay diferencia entre ella y mi madre." El niño le respondió: "Es lo que usted dice, pero que diferencia más grande hay entre los hijos!"

Entonces, Fulton Sheen reflexionó: "Así se responde. Porque Nuestro Señor es tan diferente a todos los demás hijos, nosotros consideramos a su Madre por sobre todas las demás madres. Porque El tiene una generación eterna en el seno del Padre como Hijo de Dios y una generación temporal en el seno de María como Hijo del Hombre, su venida ha creado un nuevo grupo de relaciones. Ella no es una persona privada; todas las otras madres lo son. Nosotros no la hemos hecho diferente sino que la encotramos diferente. Nosotros no elegimos a María, El lo hizo."

La Iglesia reconoce que María, Theotokos, la Madre de Dios, reafirma la realidad de la Encarnación porque – como dice San Agustín: "Si la Madre fuera ficticia, la carne de Jesús también sería ficticia . . . y así también las escaras de su resurrección." (Tract. In Ev. Ioannis, 8, 6-7).

Entonces, hoy y siempre, rezamos: "Santa María, Madre de Dios, ruega por nosotros!"


I hope You like my forget-me-not flowers, Jesus! They are my *favorite* flowers to make.
