Some years ago, I read in a journal this sentence from a theologian: "I don't like talking about 'converts' and 'converting' and 'conversion.'

Somehow it suggests a kind of betrayal – turning away from what one held before, turning one back on all that was past as though it had no value at all."

These words sound quite contrasting with the mission of Christ. The first words that we hear from Jesus's mission are "Repent and believe in the Gospel," (Mk. 1:15).

Conversion means accepting, by a personal decision, the saving sovereignty of Jesus and becoming his disciple. In *Redemptoris Missio* (The Mission of the Redeemer) St. John Paul II teaches that "Nowadays, the call to conversion which missionaries address to non-Christians is put into question or passed over in silence. It is seen as an act of 'proselytizing;' it is claimed that it is enough to help people to become more human or more faithful to their own religion, that it is enough to build communities capable of working for justice, freedom, peace, and solidarity. What is overlooked is that every person has the right to hear the 'Good News' of the God who reveals and gives himself in Christ."

People have the right to hear the Good News of the Gospel and know the treasures of the Catholic Church, and we have an obligation to proclaim it. Conversion is not a betrayal, but it is fidelity to God's grace. Without God's friendship and without Jesus's blessing in our lives, everything we possess becomes worthless.







## Reflexión Semanal



Hace algunos años, leí en una revista esta frase de un teólogo: "No me gusta hablar acerca de los 'conversos,' del 'convertirse' y de la 'conversión.' De algún modo, esto sugiere un tipo de traición – abandonar lo que uno había sostenido antes, darle la espalda al pasado como si no tuviera valor alguno." Estas palabras contrastan de verdad con la misión de Jesucristo. Las primeras palabras que escuchamos en la misión de Jesús son "Conviértanse y crean en el Evangelio," (Mc. 1:15).

La conversión significa aceptar, a través de una decisión personal, el poder salvífico de Jesús y hacerse su discípulo. En *Redemptoris Missio* (La Misión del Redentor) San Juan Pablo II enseña que "*Hoy la llamada a la conversión, que los misioneros dirigen a los no cristianos, se pone en tela de juicio o pasa en silencio. Se ve en ella un acto de 'proselitismo;' se dice que basta ayudar a los hombres a ser más hombres o más fieles a la propia religión; que basta formar comunidades capaces de trabajar por la justicia, la libertad, la paz, la solidaridad. Pero se olvida que toda persona tiene el derecho a escuchar la 'Buena Nueva' de Dios que se revela y se da en Cristo." Las personas tienen derecho a escuchar la Buena Noticia del Evangelio y conocer los tesoros de la Iglesia Católica, y nosotros tenemos la obligación de proclamarlo. La conversión no es una traición, sino fidelidad a la gracia de Dios. Sin la amistad de Dios y sin la bendición de Jesús en nuestras vidas, todo lo que poseemos carece de valor.*


