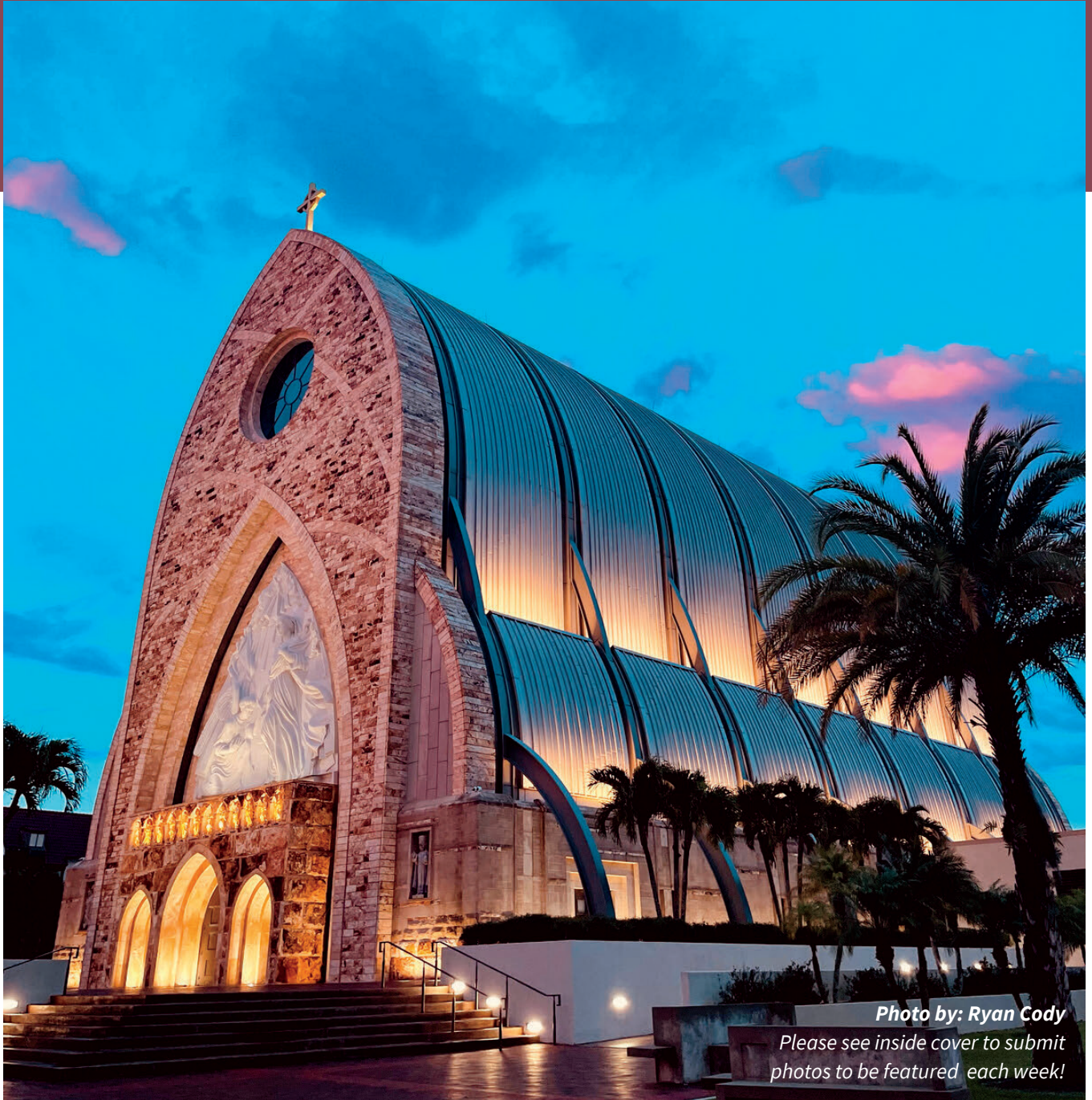

Weekly Reflection



In *Memory and Identity*, Saint John Paul II reflects on **the Virtue of Patriotism**. Is love for our country a commandment? The saint explains: *"If we ask where patriotism appears in the Decalogue, the reply comes without hesitation: it is covered by the fourth commandment, which obliges us to honor our father and mother."* We must love our parents because they gave us life (cooperating with God) and supported our physical and spiritual growth. We must also love our fatherland (*patria*) or homeland. Our country is where we are born, grow, and develop.

The virtue of patriotism most properly belongs under the virtue of justice and, more specifically, under piety which pertains to love of neighbor, love of country, and love of God. Now, there is no love without order. Then, we say: *"One nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all."* In this way, we remember that justice, liberty, and even the nation itself collapse without the firm support of God's love. We affirm our love for *"a nation under God,"* and we reject *"a nation apart from God"* or *"a nation that is God."*

What does love for our country include? Saint John Paul II teaches: *"Patriotism is a love for everything to do with our native land: its history, its traditions, its language, its natural features. It is a love that also extends to the works of our compatriots and the fruits of their genius."* All this is included when we say: God bless America!

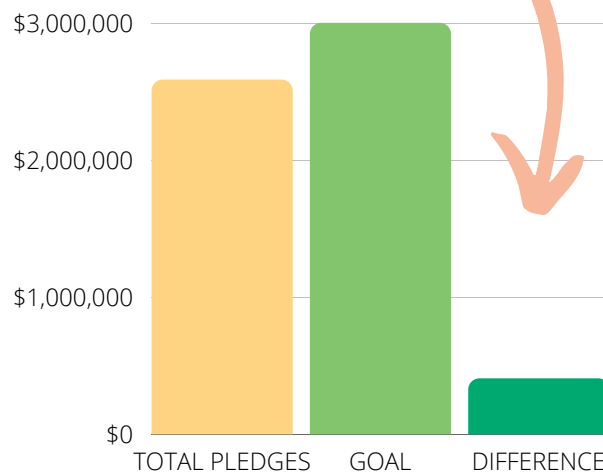
Parish Capital Campaign

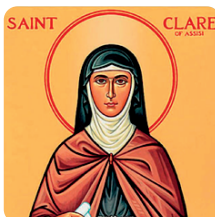

Reflexión Semanal



En su escrito *Memoria e Identidad*, San Juan Pablo II reflexiona sobre **la Virtud del Patriotismo**. ¿Es un mandamiento el amor por nuestra patria? El santo explica: “*Si preguntamos donde aparece el patriotismo en el decálogo, sin dudar esta es la respuesta: entra dentro del cuarto mandamiento que nos obliga a honrar padre y madre.*” Debemos amar a nuestros padres porque nos dieron la vida (cooperando con Dios) y nos ayudaron a crecer física y espiritualmente. Debemos también amar a nuestra patria que es el lugar donde nacemos, crecemos y nos desarrollamos.

La virtud del patriotism entra propiamente dentro de la virtud de la justicia y más específicamente se encuentra bajo la virtud de la piedad la cual dirige nuestro amor al prójimo, a la patria, y a Dios. Ahora, no hay amor si no hay orden. Entonces, nosotros decimos “*Una nación bajo Dios, indivisible, con libertad y justicia para todos.*” De este modo, recordamos que la justicia, la paz, e incluso la nación misma colapsan sin el firme fundamento del amor a Dios. Afirmamos nuestro amor por “una nación bajo Dios”, y rechazamos “una nación separada de Dios” o “una nación que toma el lugar Dios.”

¿Que incluye nuestro amor por la patria? San Juan Pablo II enseña: “*Patriotismo es un amor por todo lo que se relaciona con el lugar donde nacimos: su historia, su lengua, sus características naturales. Es un amor que también se extiende a las obras realizadas por nuestros compatriotas y al fruto de sus trabajos.*” Todo esto está incluído cuando decimos: ¡Que Dios bendiga a America! ¡Feliz Día de la Independencia!
