

#### Weekly Reflection



Penance is, after prayer, the most effective means for cleansing the soul of past faults and even for guarding it against future ones.

When Our Lord is about to begin His public ministry, He has His Precursor proclaim the necessity of penance: "Do penance: for the kingdom of heaven is at hand" (Mt 3:2). Jesus himself declares that He has come to call sinners to repentance: "I came not to call the just, but sinners to penance" (Lk 5:32).

This virtue is so necessary, that unless we do penance, we shall perish: "But except you do penance, you shall all likewise perish," (Lk 13:5) For the sinner, penance is an act of justice; for having offended God and violated God's rights, he is bound to make reparation his sins; and this he does through penance.

After giving much thought to the reason why so many souls make but little progress, Father Faber concludes that the cause is "the want of sorrow for sin." As he explains at length in his book, Growth in Holiness, chapter 19: "All holiness has lost its principle of growth if it is separated from abiding sorrow for sin. For the principle of growth is not only love, but forgiven love."

Works of penance are principles of spiritual growth. Our sacrifices have eternal meaning. May whatever good we do, and the suffering we endure, heal our souls, help us grow in holiness, and reward us with eternal life.




# PARISH CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

#### **Reflexión Semanal**




Después de la oración, la penitencia es el modo más efectivo para purificar el alma de las faltas pasadas e incluso para cuidarla de las futuras. Cuando nuestro Señor está por comenzar su ministerio, El hace que su precursor proclame la necesidad de la penitencia: *"Haced penitencia, porque el reino de los cielos esta cercano,"* (Mt. 3:2) Jesús mismo declara que El ha venido a llamar a los pecadores al arrepentimiento: *"No he venido a llamar a los justos, sino a los pecadores a la penitencia,"* (Lc. 5:32). Esta virtud es tan necesaria, que si no hacemos penitencia, pereceremos: *"Si no haceis penitencia, todos igual* 


*perecereis,* " (Lc. 13:5). Para el pecador, la penitencia es un acto de justicia, porque luego de haber ofendido a Dios y violado sus mandatos, el pecador está llamado a enmendar sus faltas; y esto lo hace por la penitencia.

Después de haber meditado la razón por la cual tantas almas progresan tan poco en la vida espiritual, el Padre Faber concluye que la causa es *"la falta de dolor por los pecados."* Como lo explica de modo extenso en su libro *Growth in Holiness*, capítulo 19: *"Toda santidad pierde su principio de crecimiento si está separada de un profundo dolor por los pecados. Porque el principio de crecimiento no sólo es el amor, sino el amor perdonado."* Las obras de penitencia son principios de crecimiento espiritual. Nuestros sacrificios tienen un significado eterno. Que cualquier bien que hagamos y cualquier sufrimiento que padezcamos, nos cure el alma, nos ayude a crecer en santidad, y nos concede el premio de la vida eterna.
