

Let us rejoice and celebrate: The Solemnity of All **Saints!** Tertullian, a very early ecclesiastical writer, tells us: "A saint is a summary of the Gospel; his good example makes others love virtue and leads them to practice it. Each of his actions condemns evil and sin."

When we honor the saints, we praise God because sanctity is God's gift. When God rewards the merits of the saints, He rewards his gifts. The saints give glory to God on earth and in heaven. They are God's triumph. The saints are the best members of the Mystical Body of Christ; fruits of his Incarnation and Redemption. Forgetting them means to forget the fruitfulness of the great works of Jesus.

They have an apologetical value too, because they show the truth of our faith in the One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church. They are a clear document of the Divine origin of the Church because with their lives, they confirm that they are good sons and daughters of a Holy Mother.

The saints give us courage. If they are saints, let us go forward! They were able to achieve the goal. We can also arrive to the same place with the grace of God! Grace is not sterile! They give us confidence and serenity. They show us the importance of heaven and eternal life, and the value of suffering that counts as nothing before the great reward that is expected. Saint Bernard tells us, "Calling the saints to mind inspires, and arouses a longing to enjoy their company. We long to share in the citizenship of heaven."

LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Continuing Our Conversation from Last Week

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

It is time for our Parish to continue our efforts for our Capital Campaign - Our Home, His House, Our Children's Future. I want to thank those who have already made a campaign pledge and I want to strongly encourage every Parish family to be part of this effort. We must prepare for the future stability of our Parish home and fulfill our obligation to repay borrowed funds used to purchase our beautiful and iconic Ave Maria Church and to repair the roof and the interior of the Church.

Our Capital Campaign – *Our Home, His House, Our Children's Future* – began in January of 2020 with commitments of \$1,455,548. Two-thirds of that amount has been received to date and we hope to receive the remaining one-third during the upcoming months. Two hundred fifty-five families participated in our beginning effort. This Campaign will run through 2022, but I anticipate that longer commitments would be needed. As you read in our Parish Financial Report, the fulfillment of our financial obligations totals \$9.9 million, and besides, we need to maintain our buildings and support our pastoral programs. Please, bring these needs to prayer and see how you can help. I ask every family and every Ave Maria Parish member to participate at the level you consider possible. Our challenge goal for this Campaign is \$2 million and our victory goal is \$3 million. To reach such a goal, every donation counts!

We will be hosting two Town Hall Meetings in our Ave Maria Parish Hall to give you the opportunity to ask any questions you may have about the financial situation of Ave Maria Parish. These Town Hall Meetings are scheduled from 7:00 pm to 8:00 pm on Wednesday, November 10th, and Tuesday, November 16th, 2021. Please, come with your questions and suggestions. Please, go to our Parish website, find the highlighted Town Hall event, and send us the confirmation of your attendance so that we can plan these gatherings.

In the next few weeks, you will receive a pledge card encouraging you to state what you can do for this Campaign. Please, know we cannot do this without the cooperation of everyone. May God bless you and your family! May Our Blessed Mother protect you! May St. Joseph guard you!



Born out of brokenness, Fraternus was envisioned to "turn the hearts of fathers toward their sons."



But to make that happen your help is needed. We would like to invite you to attend an informational meeting for the re-launching of the *Fraternus* Chapter here in Ave Maria Parish! An Informational Meeting will be held on Tuesday, November 2, 2021, 7:30-8:30pm at the Parish

We will review what *Fraternus* is all about, the essential elements of the program, and what it takes to develop a strong and vibrant chapter. We are looking for a core group of dedicated men who are able and willing to share their God given talents with their sons and the young men of this parish.

What is *Fraternus*? *Fraternus* is a group of men and boys who gather weekly for prayer, study of the virtues, meal sharing, and recreation.

What is the qualifying age for Fraternus? 12 years of age and up. We set up age-appropriate squads led by Dads and men to help guide the boys as needed. Boys progress through ranks right up until Knighthood and beyond. All adults must be Virtus Certified and Fingerprinted to be able to participate in the program –no exceptions.

Alegrémonos y celebremos: ¡La Solemnidad de Todos los Santos! Tertuliano, un antiguo autor eclesiástico, decía: "Un santo es un resumen del Evangelio. Su buen ejemplo nos hace amar la virtud y nos lleva a practicarla. Cada una de sus acciones condena el mal y el pecado." Cuando honramos a los santos, honramos a Dios porque la santidad es un don de Dios. Cuando Dios premia los méritos de los santos, El premia los dones que El mismo les ha dado. Los santos dan gloria a Dios en la tierra y en el cielo. Ellos son el triunfo de Dios. Los santos son los mejores miembros del Cuerpo Místico de Cristo; frutos de su Encarnación y Redención.

Olvidarse de ellos, significa olvidarse de la fecundidad de las grandes obras de Jesucristo. Ellos también tienen un valor apologético porque nos muestran la verdad de nuestra fe in la Iglesia que es Una, Santa, Católica y Apostólica. Ellos son un claro testimonio del origen divino de la Iglesia ya que confirman la Santidad de la Madre que los hizo hijos buenos. Los santos nos alientan. ¡Si ellos son santos, sigamos adelante! Sacramentos, Preparación, Quinceañera, y RCIA

El **bautismo**, nos introduce a las aguas salvadoras que nos trae el Espíritu Santo y nos hace miembros de la Iglesia.

La **confesión,** nos hace vivir la misericordia de Dios, ejercida a través del ministerio de los sacerdotes.

Primera Comunión, nos hace participar de la vida de Jesús, recibiendo su Cuerpo, Sangre, Alma y Divinidad bajo la apariencia de pan y vino.

Confirmación, nos sella por medio de los dones del Espíritu Santo para ser testigos vivos de Cristo.

Unción de los enfermos, nos da la fortaleza espiritual e incluso física en tiempos de enfermedad o en peligro de muerte.

Las **quinceañeras** son celebraciones que tradicionalmente las familias hispanas hacen para dar gracias a Dios por el don de la vida de quien cumple los 15 años y para pedir las bendiciones de Dios.
