

# Weekly Reflection

According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, "It is the duty of citizens to contribute along with the civil authorities to the good of society in a spirit of truth, justice, solidarity, and freedom . . . Submission to legitimate authorities and service of the common good require citizens to fulfill their roles in the life of the political community" (No. 2239). Now, "submission to authority and coresponsibility for the common good make it morally obligatory to pay taxes, to exercise the right to vote, and to defend one's country" (No. 2240).

Democracy relies on freedom. But freedom is inseparable from responsibility, and responsibility is inseparable from conscience, and conscience is inseparable from religion, and religion is inseparable from God.

It is our solemn duty as Catholics, to be conscious of our duty to America, and to preserve its freedom by preserving its faith in God. In 2012, in the context of an interview, Archbishop Chaput said: "We do believe in the separation of church and state, but we don't believe in the separation of faith from our political life."

Then, when we exercise our civic duties, as the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops expresses, we should focus more on moral principles than on the latest polls. (Faithful Citizenship).



not to mind earthly things, but rather to love heavenly things, that while all things around us pass away, we even now may hold fast those things which last forever.










# Parish Capital Campaign


