

Weekly Reflection



Last week, we said that the construction of a Christian Culture begins with our submission to the truth. This week, let us consider how **man's cultural effort also requires submission to beauty.**

St. Thomas Aquinas, quoting Dionysius, indicates that "beauty results from the concurrence of clarity and due proportion," and thus "God is said to be beautiful, as being 'the cause of the harmony and clarity of the universe," (*Summa Theologiae*, II-II q.145, a2).

Beauty is what we perceive in the stained-glass windows of the Gothic Churches and Cathedrals. Gothic architecture flourished in Europe from the 12th to the 16th Century. Here in America, we can see some of those Churches in New York, Boston, and Philadelphia. The giant and elaborate stained glass windows are the heart of Gothic architecture. These windows depict Biblical scenes with harmony and color. And they are, indeed, breathtaking!

The stained-glass window is a symbol of our Catholic culture. With clarity and harmony, we are called to show the beauty of our faith. When someone tries to impose darkness and disorder, or in other words, when someone tries to impose ugliness, we must show beauty. One day Dostoevsky made an enigmatic remark: "Beauty will save the world." When lies and evil seem to dominate the world, the light and harmony of beauty will call people to come to their senses.




PARISH CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

Reflexión Semanal




La semana pasada decíamos que la construcción de una cultura católica comienza con la sumisión a la verdad. Esta semana, consideremos como **el esfuerzo cultural del hombre también requiere una sumisión a la belleza.**

Santo Tomás de Aquino, citando a Dionisio, indica que "la belleza es el resultado de la unión de la claridad y la proporción," y de este modo, "se dice que Dios es Belleza, ya que es 'la causa de la armonía y claridad del universo," (Suma teológica, II-II q.145, a.2).

Belleza es lo que percibimos en los vitrales de las Iglesias y Catedrales góticas. La arquitectura gótica floreció en Europa entre los siglos 12 y 16. Aquí en America, podemos ver algunas de esa Iglesias en Nueva York, Boston y Filadelfia. Los gigantes y elaborados vitrales son el corazón de la arquitectura gótica. Estos vitrales muestran las escenas bíblicas con armonía y color. ¡Y son verdaderamente asombrosos!

El vitral es un símbolo de nuestra cultura católica. Con claridad y armonía, estamos llamados a mostrar la belleza de nuestra fe. Cuando alguien trata de imponer oscuridad y desorden, o en una palabra, cuando alguien trata de imponer la fealdad, debemos mostrar belleza. Un día Dostoevsky hizo un comentario enigmático: "La belleza salvará al mundo." Cuando las mentiras y la maldad parecen dominar el mundo, la luz y la armonía de la belleza llamarán a las personas a su sano juicio.
